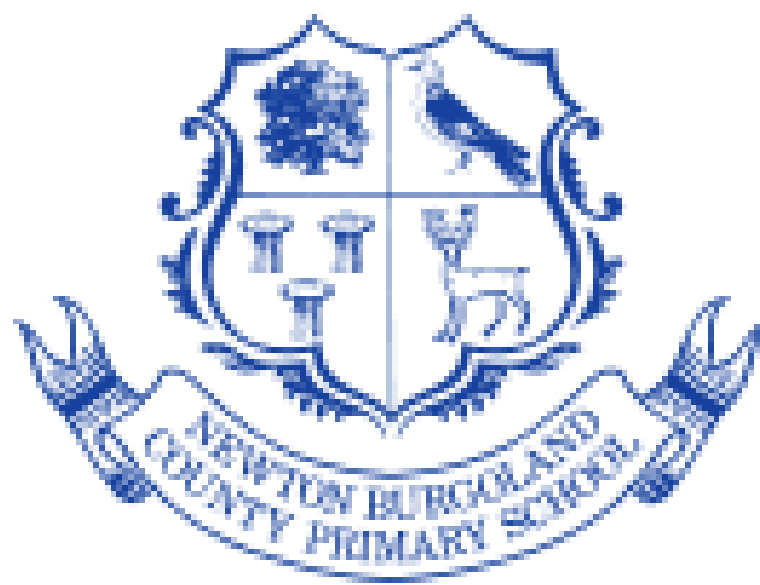

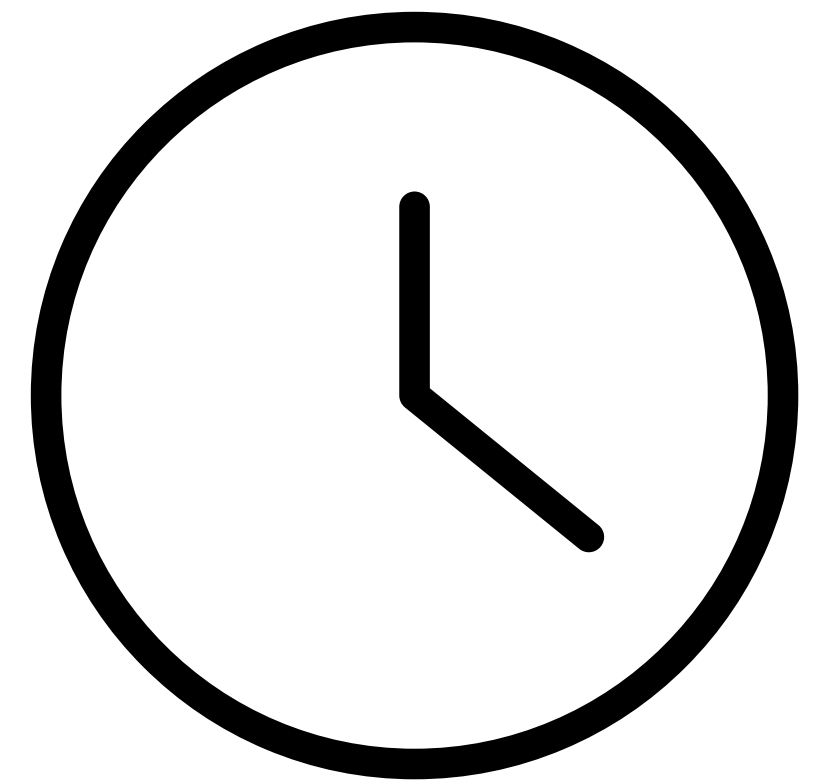
School Day timings

End of day 3:15pm

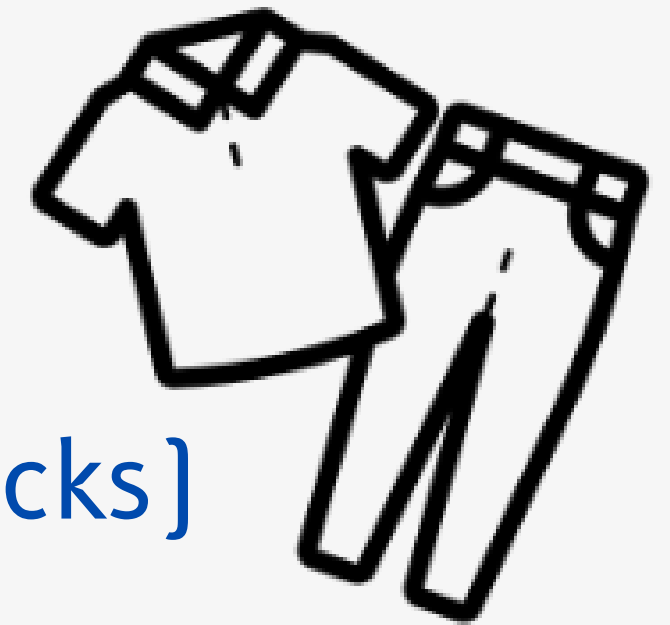


Clothes to wear for school

Our Governing Body believes that all children should attend school neatly and suitably dressed and expect pupils to wear the school colours.

Our Uniform

- royal blue sweatshirt with or without school emblem
- royal blue or white polo shirt with or without school emblem
- grey or black trousers/skirt
- sensible flat black shoes
- blue pique dress
- royal blue book bags with school emblem [no rucksacks]



Clothes to wear for school

PE Uniform

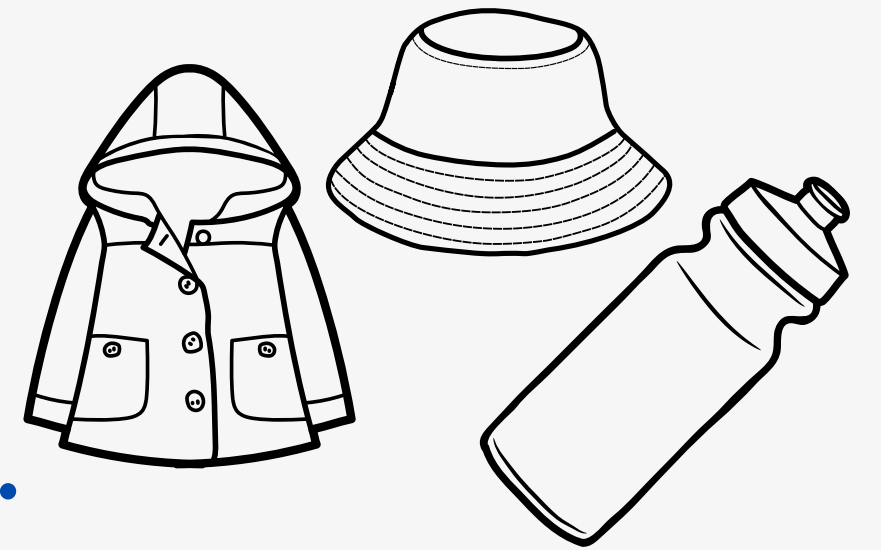
- royal blue hoodie
- navy blue jogging bottoms or leggings
- navy blue shorts [no cycling shorts]
- royal blue t-shirt



A PE uniform pack, printed with the pupils' name, can be ordered online from Liss Sport. There is no requirement for pupils to have branded PE uniform, as long as any items purchased from elsewhere are in the correct school colours and have minimal, discreet branding.

Things to Bring to School

- Suitable coats nothing too special as it is likely to get sandy, muddy or wet
- Hats, scarves, gloves and sun hats [where applicable]
- Water bottles
- Spare clothes in a draw string bag to be left at school.
- Book bags, reading records and reading books these are checked and changed regularly.



Please make sure all items are named. It saves a lot of confusion in class and helps children to take responsibility for their belongings.

We ask that parents are as organised as possible and support your child by remembering to send in these key items when they are needed.

Breakfast and After-School Clubs

Our popular Early Bird Club runs daily, all term from 7.45am until school starts. The cost is £5 per child at present. Pupils are offered milk, cereal, toast and fruit on arrival.

We also offer a late stay club Monday to Thursday from 3.20 to 5.20pm. The cost will be £14.00 per child per session. Late club will start with a fruit snack. A sandwich tea can be ordered via Relish.

Childcare vouchers will be accepted for all wrap around care.

- Environment which is developed around children's individual interests.
- Primarily learn through a variety of play and real life experiences.

Reading in Class 1

- Reading is one of the most important skills your child will learn in the early years at school.
- At Newton Burgoland, we follow the phonics scheme Little Wandle. We found that It helps develop confident readers who foster a love of reading.
- Shortly after your child has started with us, they will bring home a wordless book to help open up an entire world of talk and discussion.

Join us in September for our Phonics Parent Meeting. This session will help you support your child's reading journey and your attendance can make a real difference in their progress.

Things you can do to help

Between now and September...

- Lots of counting, both reciting and counting objects accurately.
- Learning to recognise numbers
- Singing nursery rhymes.
- Reading stories and talking about them.
- Lots of drawing, colouring , playdough and Lego to help build up hand strength.
- Lots of talking; promoting communication by discussing what you do over the summer etc.
