## **Review of the Year**

A jam-packed year in Class 1! In the Autumn we learnt about Hot and Cold Places, which focused on comparing Africa and Antarctica and how animals adapt to survive. We learnt about Shackleton's Endurance expedition and how he survived along with his crew. We wrote fact files about polar bears too.

Our Spring term was all about the Solar System! We explored the National Space Centre in Leicester as part of our Space and the Moon Landings theme. In learning about timelines in history we were able to create one of Neil Armstrong's life and how it compared to Emilia Earhart in learning about the history of flight. The children presented an amazing assembly to parents and the whole school about what they had learnt. We wrote instructions about how to make a model space rocket and leant about primary colours and mixing to create secondary colours though observing art work by the Russian abstract artist, Kandinsky, who pa9inte to music. Our final theme in the summer term has been Growing and Life-Cycles. We grew our own bean plants and set up an experiment to see what plants needed to grow. We also grew our own Painted Lady butterflies from caterpillar's. We were so excited to observe them grow and change as well as finally releasing them outside. Our school garden looks amazing and we have enjoyed eating some of the produce this week in our spinach salads. We have explored flowers through looking closely, progressing to observational drawing with water-colours through the works of the American artist Georgia

O'Keeffe.

In Maths we have made great progress with subertising, place value, calculating with numbers, measures and finding patterns with the number system.

We explored the faiths of Christianity, Judaism and Islam and learning about the pulse and how to appraise different types of music as well as performing together with percussion instruments. And...finally we have read so, so many books together and enjoyed learning about a few key children's authors along the way. An amazing year Class 1. Well done!

Class 2 Year 2 have had a very busy year!

We've learned all about the Great Fire of London and shopping in the past in History. In Geography children have learned all about maps and using a key, as well as life in Kenya and how it's different from life where we live. In science we have learned all about habitats, materials and more recently living things including humans and how to stay healthy. In DT children had a go at sewing, designed and made cards with different mechanisms and recently tried, designed made and evaluated dips and dippers. A yummy unit of work!
