Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class and impractical for learning and playing;
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind; • Prepares the pupils for living and working in the 21C.

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this uniform policy, which will be monitored. Any pupil who falls short of these requirements will be advised of this fact by their class teacher and given the opportunity to improve. Continued failure to comply will be brought to the attention of the Headteacher.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

School Uniform List

- Royal blue cardigan, jumper or sweatshirt

- Grey trousers, pinafore, shorts, skirt or culottes
- White long or short sleeved shirt
- White/dark socks or tights
- Black or dark blue shoes

Optional Summer Uniform from Easter onwards

- Grey shorts
- Blue checked dress
- Black or dark blue shoes
- White or dark socks or tights

P.E. Kit – PE kit is worn to school on the days children have PE and may be worn by pupils in class 1 and 2 every day as it is more practical for active learning indoors and outdoors. Children attending active clubs may wear PE kit on the days they attend clubs.

- Navy blue or black shorts
- Royal blue t-shirt or PE shirt
- Royal Blue Hoodie
- Royal blue or navy jogging bottoms
- Rubber soled pumps or trainers

Headscarves/Hijjab

These may be worn for religious reasons but must be in school colours – navy blue, black, or white.

Jewellery

It is not appropriate for children to wear jewellery except a sensible watch and a pair of small plain stud earrings.

Hairstyles

Hairstyles should be appropriate for school. All long hair (shoulder length or longer) should be tied back. Headbands or hair bobbles should be plain dark blue, black, or brown.

School Bags

There is no reason for children to bring large bags into school. All pupils should use a book bag sized bag. There is a great shortage of space in the cloakrooms and large bags exacerbate the problem and create a fire risk.

Equality Impact Assessment

We as a school community have a commitment to promote equality. Therefore, an equality impact assessment has been undertaken and we believe this policy is in line with the Equality Act 2010 as it is fair, it does not prioritise or disadvantage any pupil and it helps to promote equality at this school.

Monitoring and Review

The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by: seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy; considering, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform;
